CITY ADMINISTRATOR

The City Administrator's Office is responsible for the overall coordination of activities among the governmental departments. These departments include Police, Fire, Parks & Recreation, Library, Public Works, and City Clerk. This office also prepares the government portion of the City's annual operating budget. The City Administrator reports to the City's elected officials including the Mayor and Fremont's eight member City Council and works closely with the Greater Fremont Development Corporation on economic development projects. The Administrator also serves as the Plan Administrator for the City's various pension and deferred compensation plans and negotiates union contracts with union officials.




2020 PROPERTY AND EVIDENCE

The city of Fremont is divided into geographical districts with sergeants and officers assigned to each area while on patrol. Officers and Sergeants are responsible for taking reports and calls for service in the district to which they are assigned.

The Patrol Division consists of 30 sworn officers including 1 Lieutenant, 6 sergeants and 23 officers when fully staffed. 


DISTRICT MAP

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

The SRO works in all Fremont Public Schools and Archbishop Bergan Schools. There are a total of 14 schools the SRO assists. The SRO assists by providing mentoring and informal counseling to students and provides security and investigative expertise to the school system.

The SRO is responsible for the following:

- Investigates crimes that occur on school property. All types of crimes that occur within the city also occur within the schools. A few examples of crimes that occur include drug crimes, weapons, assaults, thefts, criminal mischief, parking complaints and gang identification.
- The SRO program has built good rapport and relationships with the students, staff and parents. Students come to speak with the SRO, sometimes on a daily basis, just to tell the SRO how their day is going.
- The SRO works closely with the School Truancy Officer, the Probation Office, the Dodge County Attorney's Office, and the Juvenile Diversion Program.
- The SRO plays an important role in the Crime Stoppers program in the public school system. The Crime Stoppers program has been very successful because students know they can remain anonymous.
- The SRO conducts classroom/school visits where talks are given. These talks consist of educating students about drug and alcohol abuse, making proper choices in life, internet safety, and just general question and answer sessions.

III CORPS DRUG TASK FORCE


III CORPS Drug Task Force is a multi-jurisdictional task force comprised of law enforcement agencies from Cuming, Dodge and Saunders counties, the cities of Fremont, Blair, Wahoo, and Yutan. III CORPS' inception was in October of 1997. The geographic area covered by the task force represents approximately 1,900 square miles, with a population of approximately 75,000 people including the 26,397 living in Fremont, Nebraska.

The Task Force currently has three agents assigned to work cases in our geographic area. The Task Force is headquartered in Fremont, Nebraska.

The Fremont Police Department provides two agents. The agents report directly to the III CORPS board of directors consisting of the department heads from six of the agencies located within the area of operation.

The Task Force is funded through the participating agencies. The individual agencies allocate whatever funds and resources available to support the Task Force's operations.

The pooling of inter-departmental assets, the unanimous dedication to our community and the timely infusion of federal funds has kept the III CORPS Drug Task Force in operation.


Through a grant obtained by III CORPS, the Fremont Police Department currently offers a NADDI (National Association of Drug Diversion Investigators) drop box allowing the public a safe and secure way to dispose of prescription drugs and helping to keep these drugs off the streets.

The Rx Drug Drop Box is located in the lobby of the Fremont Police Department located at 725 N. Park Ave., where prescription pills can be discarded. The drop box is available from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. Officers also will take pills at other times.

18 ACTIVE: The investigation is ongoing and the detective is still working the case.


145 CLOSED BY OTHER ACTION

The Investigations Division is commanded by **Lieutenant Shane Wimer**. The division is responsible for the investigation of significant cases involving a special subject matter, jurisdictional implications and cases that are more complicated and often more time consuming. The Investigations Unit is also responsible for the collection and preservation of evidence. Normally, the detectives will become involved with an investigation after the initial response of the Uniformed Patrol Division. They are also responsible for conducting background investigations for any person applying for a solicitation permit or liquor license within the boundaries of Fremont.

Examples of significant cases involving a special subject matter include, but are not limited to:

- property crimes such as burglary, fraud and forgeries,
- physical and sexual assault, child abuse and neglect,
- death investigations with unusual or suspicious circumstances.

2020 NOTABLE EVENTS

January 28, 2020 – a vehicle was reported stolen from a residence in the 400 block of west Jefferson Road. On the same day, a missing person report was made regarding a missing 19-year-old male who resided a short distance away from where the vehicle was reported stolen. It was learned that the 19-year-old male was on probation and was ordered to wear an ankle monitoring device. Using information recorded by the ankle device, officers were able to place the male at the scene where the car was reported stolen and he was ultimately charged with theft by unlawful taking.

On February 21, 2020 - a 20-year-old male was arrested after it was reported someone fired a handgun through the window of an assisted living facility in the 600 block of East 23rd Street. The male was identified after it was learned he was involved in a disturbance near the assisted living facility earlier in the day when he allegedly shot the taillight out of a vehicle. Nobody was injured in either shooting.

On March 20, 2020 - a 49-year-old woman was arrested for Theft by Unlawful Taking after she borrowed an acquaintance's car and then refused to give it back. She was taken into custody after she was observed driving the vehicle.



On March 25, 2020 – Governor Pete Ricketts announced that the state's second COVID-19 related Directed Health Measure (DHM) includes Lancaster, Saunders and Dodge counties, which will be in effect until May 6, 2020 unless renewed. The DHM imposes enforceable limit on public gatherings, which applies to theaters, churches, gyms, social clubs, salons, and social gatherings (weddings and funerals). Among other steps, the DHM requires restaurants and bars in these areas to close their dining areas immediately and move to takeout service, delivery, and/or curbside service only until further notice. Schools in these areas are directed to operate without students in their buildings.

On April 5, 2020 – In an effort to prevent, limit and slow the spread of COVID-19, the Fremont Board of Health issued a Community Directed Health Measure directing beauty salons, nail salons, barber shops, gyms, fitness centers, tattoo parlors, and massage therapist establishments to cease operations to remain in effect until May 6, 2020.

On April 7, 2020 - a 44-year-old man was arrested on the charge of Stalking after it was reported he had been harassing and following his wife, from whom he was separated for nearly a year.

On May 11, 2020 – relaxed Directed Health Measure (DHM), becomes effective in Three Rivers Health District, including Dodge, Saunders and Washington counties. Restaurants are allowed to open to 50 percent occupancy.

On May 19, 2020 a 19-year-old man was arrested following a two-vehicle personal injury accident in the 1600 block of North Clarkson Street. The man violated a stop sign and crashed into another vehicle. The occupants of the second car required medical treatment for their injuries. The man fled on foot before officers arrived. He was later spotted by Dodge County Deputies and, following a foot chase, was taken into custody and charged with multiple offenses including Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol.


On May 21, 2020 – a 30-year-old male was arrested after he was observed driving into the parking lot of an apartment complex in the 2600 block of Laverna Street and striking two parked cars. The man walked away from the scene before officers arrived, but was later found and taken into custody.

2020 NOTABLE EVENTS

On May 23, 2020 – a structure fire was reported at an apartment complex in the 300 block of North Main Street. After first responders arrived, they located the body of a 56-year-old woman who had been unable to leave her apartment.

On May 23, 2020 - a 22-year-old man was arrested and charged with numerous offenses after officers were called to a business in the 3000 block of East 23rd Avenue North where it was reported the man was causing a disturbance. As officers attempted to speak to the man, he sped off in his vehicle. The man left the City of Fremont and was pursued by Nebraska State Troopers at speeds exceeding 100 miles per hour. The man drove back into the City of Fremont at a high rate of speed, nearly causing several accidents. He was eventually taken into custody by the Nebraska State Patrol and Dodge County Sheriff's Office after he ran out of gas.

Late May – Early June, 2020 - Protestors in Fremont gathered in solidarity to protest the death of George Floyd. These types of peaceful protests were being held in cities throughout the country for solutions to systemic inequality and police brutality.



On June 6, 2020 - a 47-year-old man was arrested and charged with numerous offenses after officers were called to a physical domestic disturbance at a residence in the 2600 block of North Laverna Street. After officers arrived, the man was combative and a TASER device was deployed to take him into custody. The man was taken to Fremont Methodist Health hospital to be medically cleared and, while there, he physically assaulted the arresting officer.

On June 22, 2020 – a new State of Nebraska Directed Health Measure (DHM) takes effect, ushering in Phase III of reopening Nebraska.

On August 1, 2020 - a man reported he had been swindled out of \$10,000.00 by another man who promised to do some work around the man's house. After an investigation by the Fremont Police Detective Bureau a 59-year-old man was arrested and charged with Theft.

On August 15, 2020 - a 33-year-old woman was charged with drug offenses and Child Abuse after a minor child in her home started a fire while playing with a lighter. Officers learned that fire department personnel who entered the home to fight the fire observed drug paraphernalia in the home. It was learned the woman had used drugs prior to the fire and was asleep when her child accidentally started the fire.

On August 22, 2020 - a woman complained that a store employee who delivered groceries to her home had exposed himself to her while in her home. Following an investigation, a 51-year-old man was charged with Public Indecency and Disturbing the Peace in connection with this incident.

On August 22, 2020 - a 49-year-old man and a 48-year-old woman were charged with Theft by Shoplifting after it was determined that between June 6, 2020 and August 22, 2020 they committed 20 acts of theft at a local retailer. The dollar amount of the theft was over \$400.00.

2020 NOTABLE EVENTS

On August 26, 2020 - a burglary was reported at a business in the 300 block of North Main Street. It was reported an unknown person forcibly entered the business through a back door. Once inside, the perpetrator took items including alcoholic beverages, a safe, and a 9mm pistol. Total value of the stolen items was nearly \$2000.00. Fremont Police Detectives found fingerprints at the scene and a 24-year-old man was eventually identified as the suspect and arrested.

On September 14, 2020 – Three Rivers Public Health Department, which includes Dodge, Saunders and Washington counties, joins the majority of the State of Nebraska in Phase IV of reopening, which lifts nearly all restrictions.

On September 17, 2020 - a 30-year-old male was charged with Child Abuse after a minor child was seen at the Fremont Methodist Health hospital with burns on its body. The investigation revealed the minor child was left unattended and was scalded by hot bath water.

On October 5, 2020 - a 32-year-old male was seen at the Fremont Methodist Health hospital with injuries suffered when he was run over by a vehicle being driven by another male following an argument. A 25-year-old male was eventually arrested and charged with numerous offenses including Use of a Weapon to Commit a Felony.

On October 14, 2020 - a 22-year-old man was arrested for Theft by Deception after he attempted to purchase tires from a local auto parts store using a bogus credit card. Investigator's learned the man had used the same card to fraudulently purchase \$8000.00 in tires from an auto parts store in another town.

On October 17, 2020 - a 29-year-old man reported that his vehicle had been stolen from the driveway of his residence. An officer later located the man's vehicle in the parking lot of a convenience store not far away from the man's residence. The officer viewed security footage from the store and determined the man drove his car to the convenience store the day before he reported it stolen. The man was charged with a False Reporting and Obstructing Government Operations



On November 27, 2020 – the Fremont Board of Health passed a measure requiring people five years and older to wear a face covering over the mouth and nose while indoors in premises open to the general public. People who violate the order would be subject to a misdemeanor for each offense. This order went into effect November 28, 2020 at 12:01 a.m. with a scheduled end date of January 31, 2021. Following a January Board of Health meeting, the mandate was extended to March 31, 2021.

On December 4, 2020 - a shoplifting complaint was made at a sporting goods store in the 1200 block of East 23rd Street. It was reported that a man left the store with approximately \$500.00 in stolen merchandise. The man was observed getting into a car which then fled east on 23rd Street at a high rate of speed. A short time later, a Dodge County Deputy came across the car after it crashed east of Fremont. After a short foot chase, a 34-year-old man was caught and charged in connection with the shoplifting.

On December 31, 2020 - officers received a complaint of a pickup truck sitting motionless in the roadway in the 1300 block of Bell Street. Officers arrived on scene. As they were approaching the pickup, a man inside sped away, jumping a curb and crashing through the fence of a residence in the 1200 block of North Bell Street. With their guns drawn, the officers got the man out of the vehicle. It was later determined that the pickup had been reported stolen from another city. The man driving, a 28-year-old, was charged with Theft and drug offenses.



INCIDENT REPORTS GENERATED - 4,388






